Consider Joining Our Board – Two Onen Positions!

We currently have two open positions on our Volunteer Board and would love for you to consider joining our team. Elections are coming up this October, so if you're interested, please submit your name by September 21st to be on the ballot. Requirements to Join:

- You must be in good standing (i.e., all dues and fines paid).
- Be available for a minimal of quarterly Board & one Annual meetings.
- Participate in email voting between meetings – this is essential to keeping things running smoothly.

Let us explain how the Board functions currently:

To streamline responsibilities, we've moved to holding quarterly meetings, which is fully compliant with Washington State law (RCW 64.38 & 64.90]) and actually the norm for self-managed older neighborhoods like ours with fewer than 100 lots. We plan to continue with this meeting schedule and hope to include the allowance of monthly or quarterly in our upcoming bylaw revisions.

Important Note on Voting:

Though we meet less often, we're still getting a lot done. Between meetings, voting by email allows the Board to make decisions efficiently. According to state requirements (RCW 64.38.035(4)), 100% of the Board must participate in each vote, and votes must be recorded electronically, so no abstaining is allowed.

If you can commit to:

- Attending four quarterly meetings and one Annual Meeting per year,
- Responding to Board email votes,
- And contributing to shared duties as needed...

...then we'd be happy to have you run in the election or be considered for appointment.

We have a strong team and believe we've built a solid foundation to keep things moving forward. If you're interested, please reach out. We'd love to have you on board!
